

Name Revealed for Javier Plascencia's Little Italy Project

Eater readers have been hungry for more details on the highly anticipated new restaurant





We've got a name for you, and more details on the concept that'll be showcased in the 4,800-square-foot space. It will be called **Bracero: Cocina Mexicana de Raiz**. Meaning "one who works with their hands & arms", the name is derived from the Bracero Program, which brought millions of agricultural laborers from Mexico into the U.S. starting in the early '40s.

Inspired by the Plascencia Group's existing restaurants, including Romesco http://romescomexmed.com and Finca Altozano http://fincaltozano.com, the **menu will be mostly modern Mexican cuisine**.

According to Steve Donlon of Ariel Suites, where Bracero will keep company with **Pan Bon**, an Italian market-meets-eatery, http://sandiego.eater.com/archives/2014/08/12/allday-italian-food-hub-in-the-works-for-little-italy.php> and a natural grocery store, major contraction should start in October. Each floor of the bi-level restaurant will have a **bar, kitchen and heated patio**; first floor dining will be casual, with no reservations, while the second level will take reservations and offer a more high-end experience. The upper bar plans to be dedicated to craft liquor from Mexico, including mezcal and tequila.
