When the Bells want to shake it, they opt for the Beauty Bar dance floor where they're more than likely moving to Feel the Noise, the DJ/promoter collective of Gabe Vega and Saul Q. These local boys are booked nightly, spinning an addictive blend of dance and rock from S.D. to S.F. The Bells put it simply, "They are the real deal and going places fast."

STARCHITECTURE

The receptions at the R3 Gallery (2421 India St., Little Italy) always draw a chic crowd, but it's the design element of the building that's the real work of art. "Ame [Parsley] and Lloyd [Russell] have been responsible for creating an architectural renaissance in our little city," says St. John. But don't take their word for it. Just ask the American Institute of Architects, who awarded Russell the Young Architect of the Year award for his "handmade modernism." Judging by the turnout of last opening, it was quite clear: the hipsters came out for art-or in the name of it.
